





- President Joe Biden delivered a historic formal apology on behalf of the federal government for its 150-year policy of forcibly placing Native children in Indian Boarding Schools
- "The Federal Indian Boarding School policy and the pain it has caused will always be a significant mark of shame, a blot on American history."
 "It's a sin on our [Nation's] soul."
