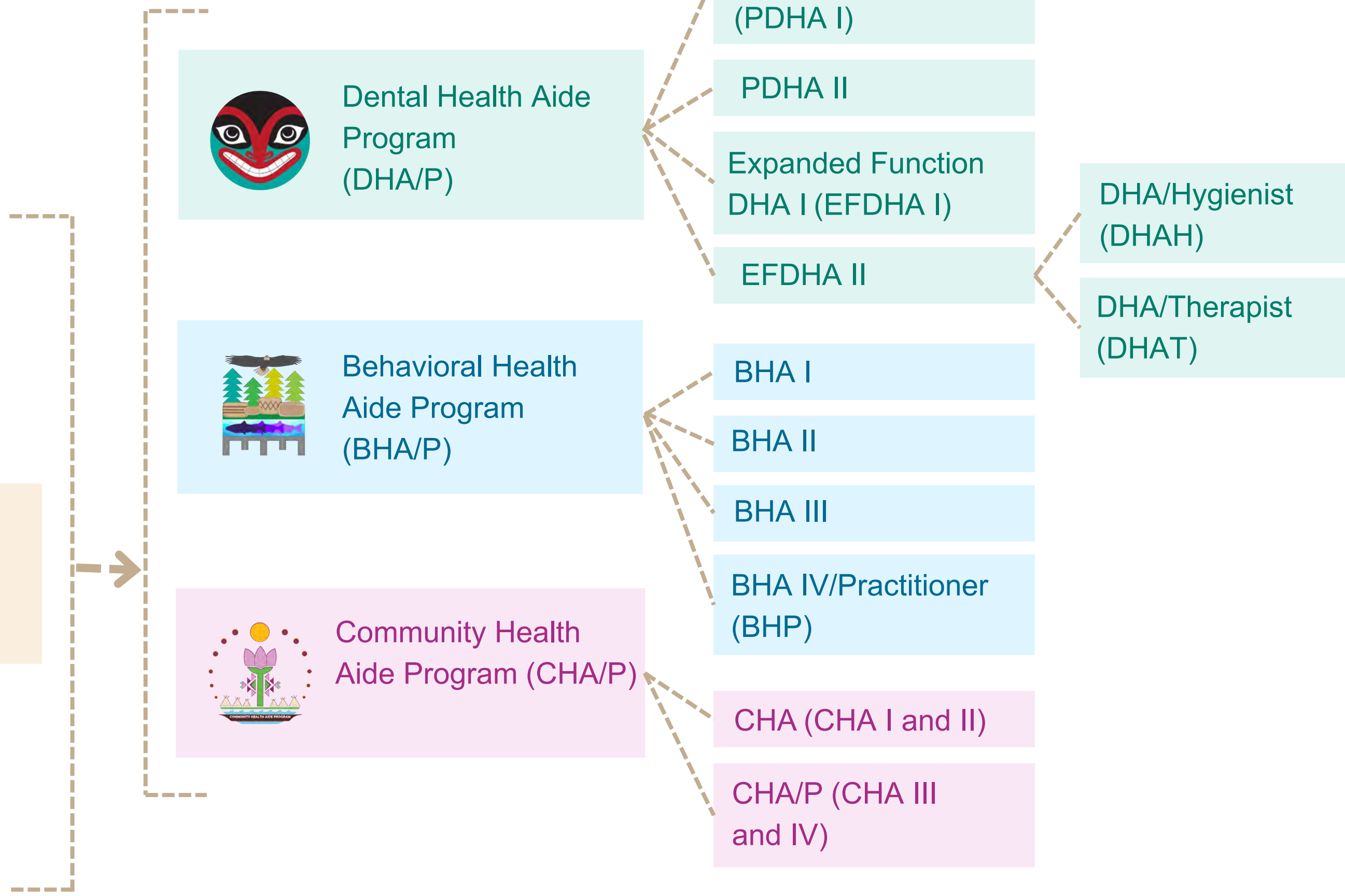

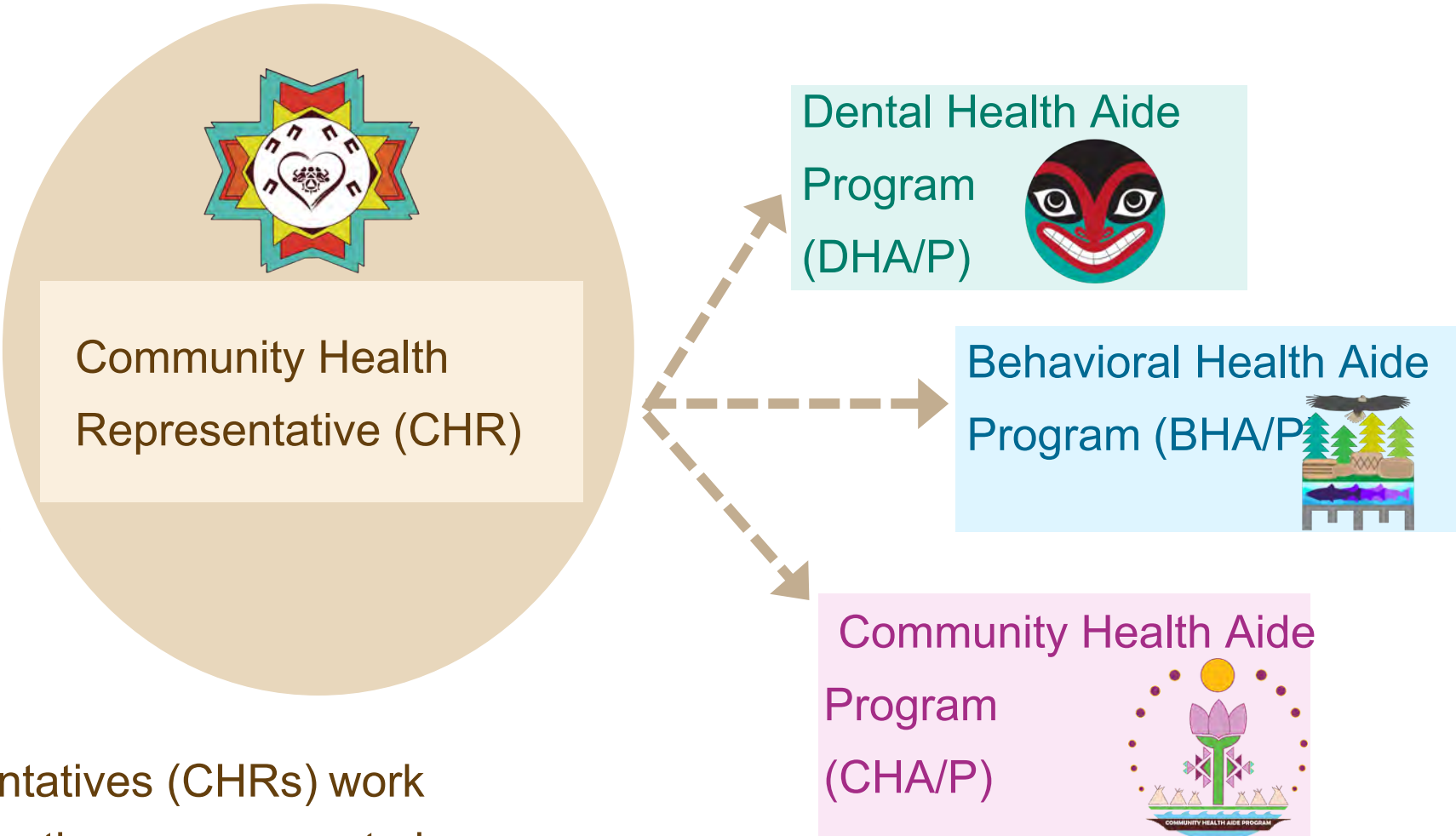
The Portland Area CHAP Certification Board (PACCB) oversees the provider certifications for the DHA, BHA, and CHA programs

- ▮ CHR Program is a unique concept for providing health care, health promotion, and disease prevention training for AI/AN students in the NW
- ▮ NPAIHB offers self-paced core and advanced training
- ▮ 156 students have gone through training over 8 cohorts since August 2023

# Community Health Aide/Practitioner

Community Health Aide Practitioners (CHA/P) are certified primary care clinicians who have close cultural ties and connections to the communities they serve. In Oregon, Washington, and Idaho they are community members of AI/AN communities who attend CHA/P educational programs approved by the Portland Area CHAP Certification Board and work within the Tribal Health and Human systems.

- *A CHA/P practices under the supervision of a licensed clinical provider, such as a physician or advanced practice provider (PA, NP).*
- *Basic education for CHA/P includes didactic learning, skills practice and training, and clinical time providing patient care with the guidance of an advanced practice provider or physician.*

## Portland Area CHA Implementation Timeline

**2021** – NPAIHB Awarded IHS funding to support CHA development and staff onboarded

**2022** – CHA Advisory Workgroup established and CHA expert contractors onboarded

**2023** - Tribal Pilot Sites established via resolutions, CHA outreach and education locally and nationally, First CHAP Symposium, Oregon CHAP SPA approved by CMS, eCHAMP development started

**2024** – CHA Education curriculum and eCHAMP were established, program outline completed, CHA S&Ps finalized, logistical site visits, student recruitment, Washington CHAP SPA approved by CMS

**2025** – Implementation of first CHA cohort

# Northwest Community Health Aide/ Practitioner Training

## CHA/P Pilot Training Format

- Launching January 2025 with CHA Foundations Course
- 3 NW Tribal training sites – Umatilla, Port Gamble Sklallam, Shoshone Bannock
- 1-2 students per site, 1 from Cherokee
- Online didactic courses – 20 hours per week
- In person skills performed for 1 week each quarter
- Clinic advance practice providers provide preceptorship
- Certification after CHA and CHP

# Dental Health Aides



Dental Health Aide Program

DHAs are primary providers that focus on prevention and basic oral health procedures. There are four categories of DHAs.

DHAs receive a federal CHAP certification to work in tribal communities under supervision of a licensed dentist or Dental Health Aide Therapist

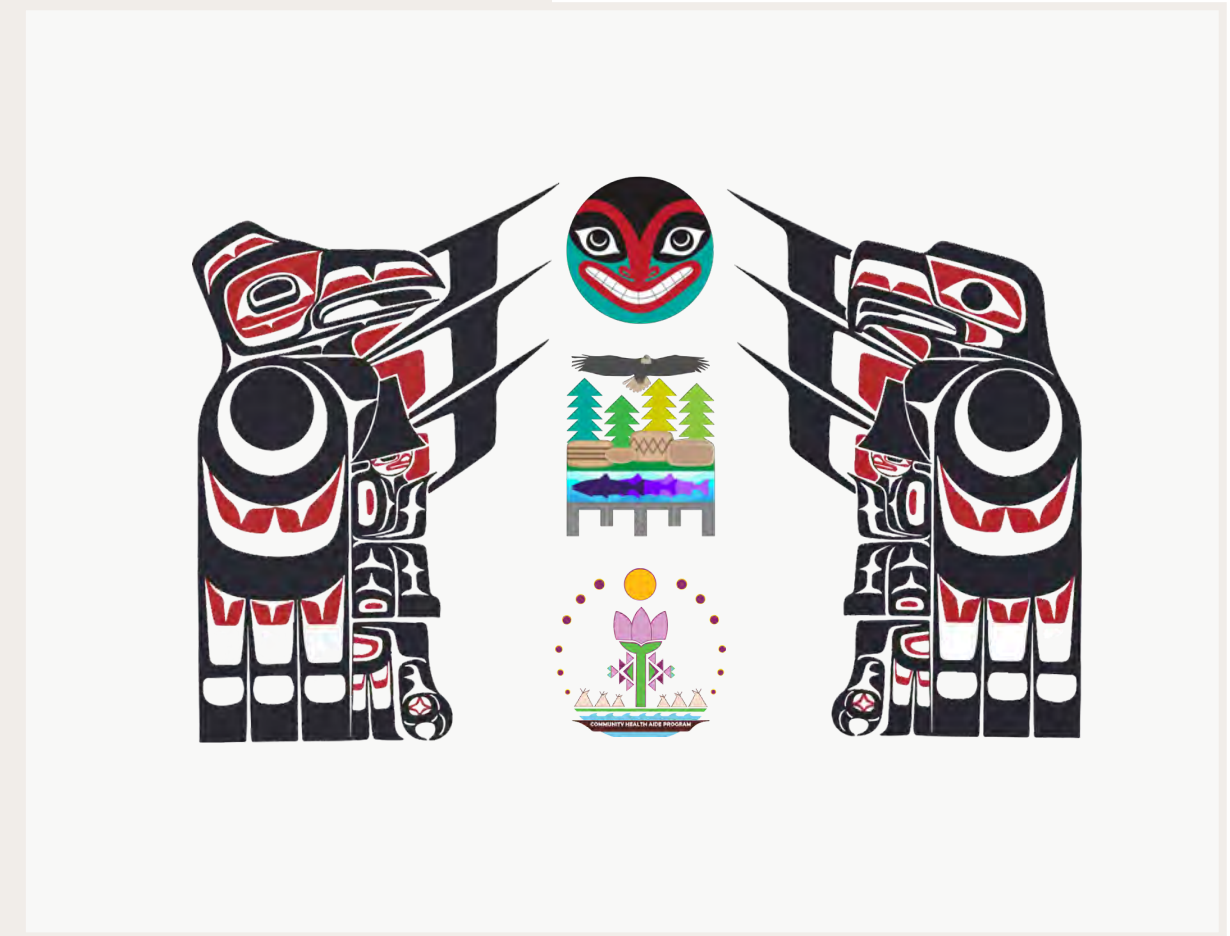


## MISSION STATEMENT

## VISION

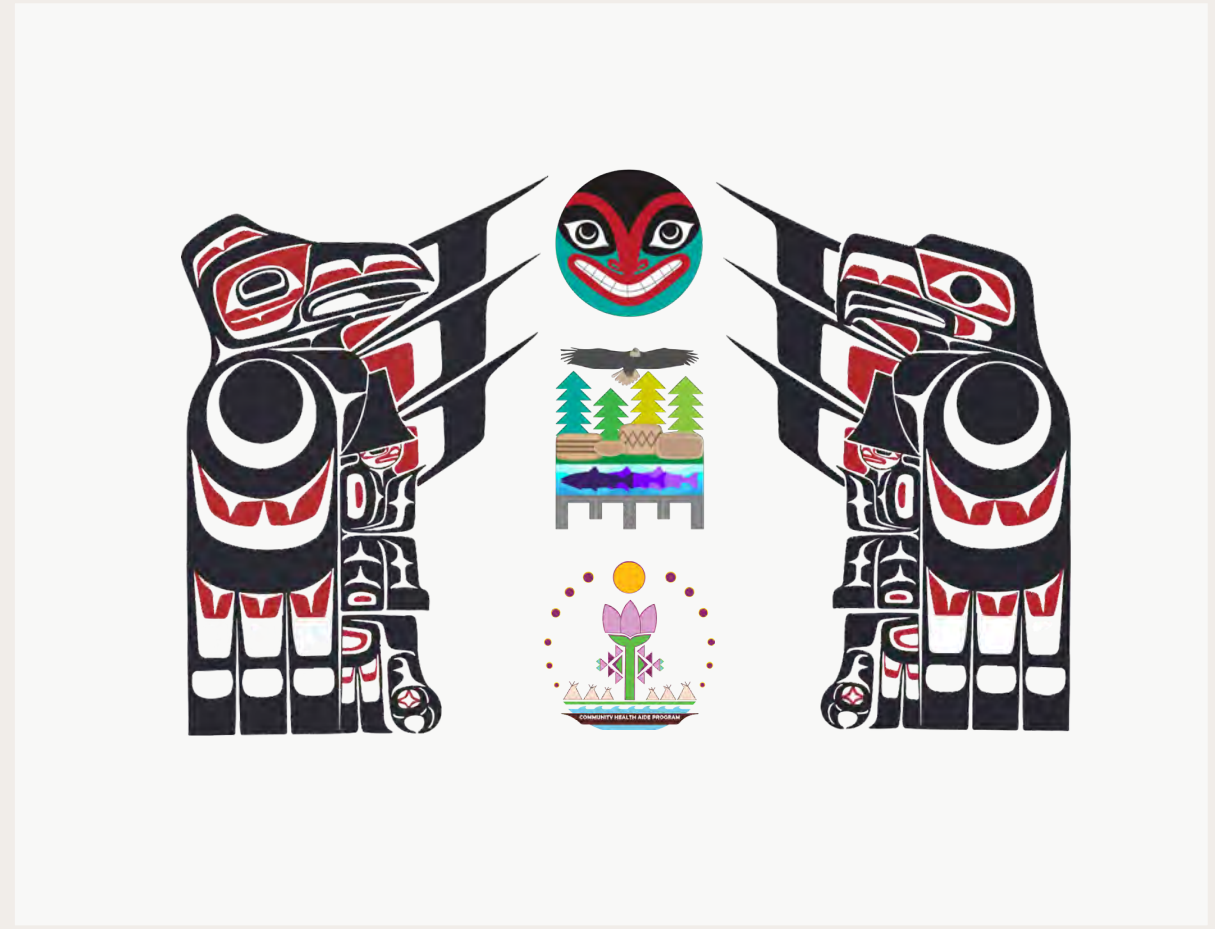

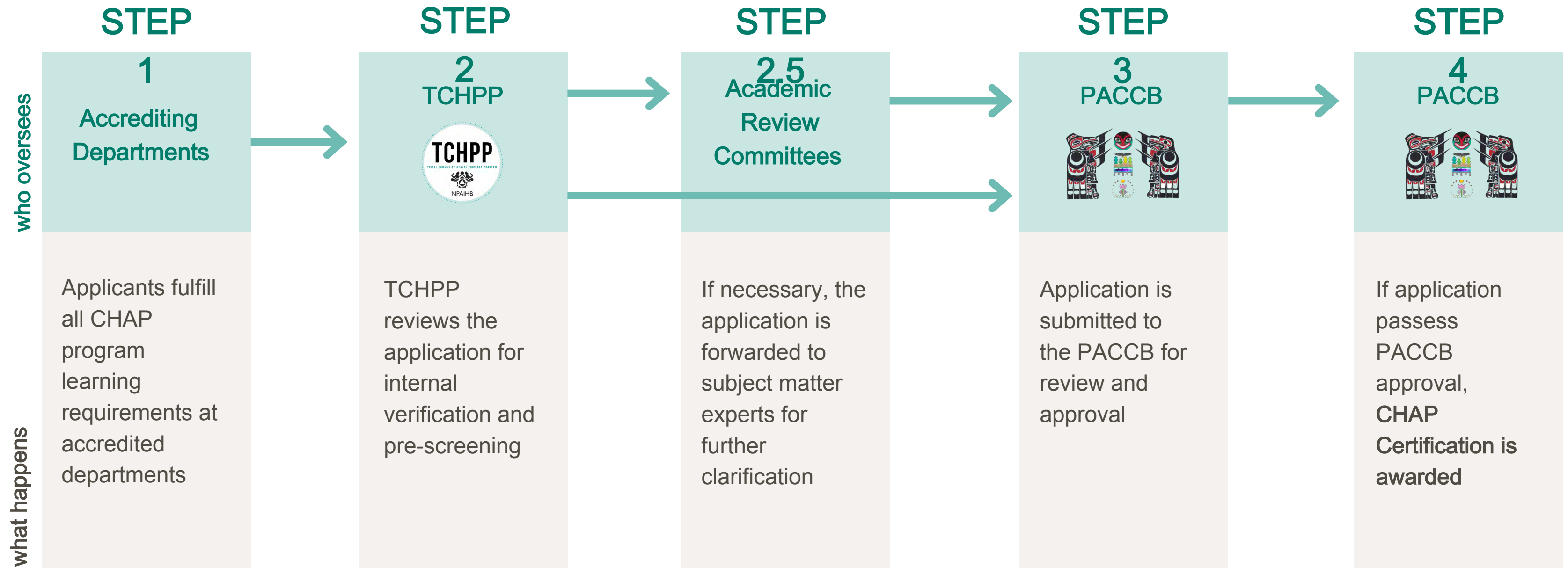

The certification process involves rigorous training and evaluation to ensure that these professionals are well prepared to deliver comprehensive care. By authorizing this certification, you will help ensure that the Indian Health Service (IHS) health facilities and programs are staffed with qualified individuals who can deliver the highest standards of care to ultimately improve health outcomes and service delivery to our patients.

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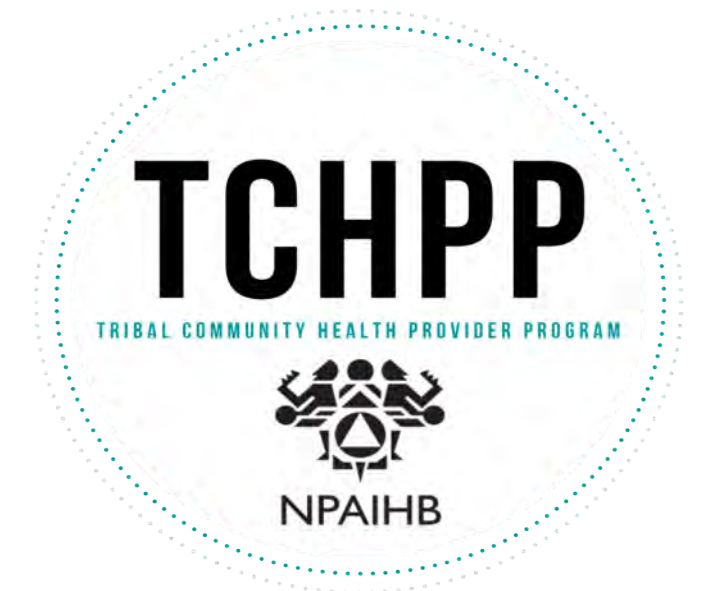
